District of Columbia

1. Update on Ongoing Initiatives:

- **Activities of the Task Force**
 - Continued efforts of the Task Force will be to get education into the community health centers and at least two birthing hospitals.
 - Next meeting is scheduled for February 2012. Time, date, and location not yet determined.
 - Working with Child and Family Services Administration on the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act, (CAPTA) legislation and ways to educate the medical community as well as the residents of the District of Columbia.
- **Ongoing FASD Initiatives in Your State**
 - Public education strategies are being developed by Task Force.
 - Collaboration with DOH Child Adolescent and School Health Bureau to provide education to middle school students.

- **Activities of the Task Force**
 - The Florida Center is trying to take on the responsibility of organizing/reconstituting The FL Interagency Action Group. Large cuts in State jobs have drastically reduced ability of State workers to serve on the task force.
 - Advocacy by the parents statewide to keep the FASD State clinic funded.
- **Ongoing FASD Initiatives in Your State**
 - FL Fights FASD Campaign is very active and continuing Torchbearer enlistment statewide. Campaign transferred to The Florida Center for Early Childhood in Sarasota on October 1.
 - Two FASD Diagnostic Centers continue to operate. Sarasota Clinic has a long wait list for assessments. Jacksonville FASD clinic continues as subcontract provider with Northrop Grumman.

 - Awaiting response on a small grant to fund innovative Batterer's Intervention SBIRT.
 - Following last year's School-Based Health Center CRAFFT SBIRT training, further plans are underway to increase data collection and provide ongoing technical assistance.

- Prenatal SBIRT assistance was requested by Brigham and Women's Hospital, which has 8,000 annual deliveries. A pilot will be initiated in the Resident Clinic with hopes to expand to all OB/GYN. The new MA FASD Prevention Women's Toolkit will be used.
- SBIRT Training, including FASD, was delivered to Family Medicine Residents at Boston Medical Center.
- School nurses requested SBIRT training. Initial planning resulted in the first regional training. Follow up trainings and technical assistance are being discussed. This initiative will be expanded across the State.
- "Treating Adults with FASD and Other Brain Disorders: Adapting Treatment and Improving Outcomes" is being presented to Western MA SUD Treatment providers in March.

Michigan

1. Update on Ongoing Initiatives:

- **Activities of the Task Force**
 - The FASD Taskforce continues to meet on a quarterly basis in Lansing, MI. The Department continues to work in collaboration with the Taskforce Co-Chairs and leadership. However, the Department no longer provides consultant and staff support for Taskforce meetings and activities.
 - During December 2011, the Taskforce submitted a technical assistance request to the FASD Center at Northrop Grumman to develop Phase 2 of the State FASD Strategic Plan, 2012-2014. Phase 2 of the Strategic Plan will focus on Youth in Transition and Adults with FASD. The Taskforce will have primary responsibility for Phase 2 development and implementation.
- **Ongoing FASD Initiatives in Your State**
 - Phase 1 of the FASD Maternal and Child Interagency Strategic Plan, 2012-2014 was completed with technical consultation assistance from Sharon Dorfman and the FASD Center at Northrop Grumman with two workshops that were held in July and November. Over 40 participants from interagency stakeholders across the State attended the strategic planning sessions.
 - Phase 1 was developed with three clearly defined goals that reflect the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) source of funding which is the Title V

- MCH block grant funding. The three goals are: (1) Prevention of Prenatal Alcohol Exposure among women of reproductive age; (2) Intervention for Children, birth to 18 years; (3) Resource Development for FASD.
- MDCH will have primary responsibility for Phase 1 implementation.

 - Our Project CHOICES Task Force continues to meet in smaller workgroups to discuss sustainability with our sites/stakeholders. We have hired a new Project Evaluator. We held a Task Force meeting in January and our next one is in March.
- **Ongoing FASD Initiatives in Your State**
 - We continue our work on our Northrop Grumman Project CHOICES subcontract. Staff turnover challenges continue at many of the sites. We started an MI coaching component.
 - Our activities with our Interagency FASD Workgroup continue.

- Our Interagency Workgroup is working on facilitating a pilot for screening youth entering foster care. This would be done in Westchester County which is a Project LAUNCH site.
- The NY ACOG chapter has been asked by the national ACOG to demo a new Toolkit for Alcohol screening & Brief Interventions for OB/GYNs. The FASD Coordinator will be on the Advisory Committee for this effort.

North Carolina

1. Update on Ongoing Initiatives:

- **Activities of the Task Force**
 - Planning for a statewide coalition is ongoing by the Project Director, FASD Clinic Coordinator, members of the Mecklenburg FASD Coalition, the State Contractor and representatives from the Division of MH/DD/SAS. Members of the Mecklenburg Coalition have agreed to grow their efforts into a statewide coalition. A strategic planning meeting was held during this quarter and the following actions occurred.
 - Lauren Borchert, Mecklenburg FASD Coalition Chair and Director of the Arc of Mecklenburg agreed to be the chair of the statewide coalition.
 - Actions items needed for developing a State plan have been determined.
 - Tentative goals were listed and a timeline for coalition meetings has been established.
 - Coordinator Janice White will attend the February meeting to discuss the enrollment list for the coalition; as well as logistics for the initial meeting.
 - Dr. Phillip May will be attending and presenting his work being conducted in NC/Mecklenburg area at the March meeting.

- **Ongoing FASD Initiatives in Your State**
 - The PD is partnering with the Zero to Three Court Team of the Qualla Boundary/ Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) to implement a comprehensive FASD plan of care; which identifies community assets and needs related to FASD, provides FASD training to service providers, develops protocols for screening at-risk children for FASD, and provides services to infants, children, and adults affected by FASD.
 - Provider training has been scheduled for Wednesday, March 7, 2012, and will take place at the Cherokee hospital on the Qualla Boundary and will be delivered by the FASD Clinic Coordinator and Clinical Geneticist.
 - The PD is currently scheduling FASD trainings for the community.
 - The PD is working with the Analenisgi, EBCI Health, and Medical Substance Abuse staff to create a job description for an FASD Case Manager.
 - FASD Training Sessions: The PD, CPR's and Coordinator provided **10** presentations/educational sessions; reaching a total of **496** participants and exhibited at a total of **2** statewide conference and **2** community events; reaching **410** individuals during this quarter.

2. New Initiatives:

- PD has established a relationship with Eastern Area Health Education Center to provide a full-day FASD education session to allied health professionals in March of 2012.
- PD is working with a representative from NC Division of MH/DD/SAS Best Practice Team in delivering an FASD webinar to perinatal workers in spring of 2012.
- PD is working with Anuvia Prevention and Recovery Center to present a 2-hour FASD session to allied health professionals in the Mecklenburg area in March/May 2012.
- PD is working with the NC Foster and Adoptive Parents Association and will be presenting two 3-hour sessions on FASD in April 2012.
- PD is working with a representative from the Division of Public Health, Women's Health Branch in delivering an FASD webinar to public health departments across the State in the fall of 2012.

 - WTOP individuals were triaged and supported by project, including ongoing follow-up and support for clients served by the Rural/Urban Women's Treatment Programs.
 - WTOP averaged 1378 minutes, the past quarter, of client contact and technical assistance provided by responding to phone, e-mail, and Web inquires within 48 hours of initial inquiry.
 - Continue working with the DCF's home visiting training and technical assistance workgroup to develop trainings addressing substance use, infant mental health, and family-centered treatment and prevention.
 - WTOP and Family Empowerment Network (FEN) Web sites – 249,035 hits and 30,616 visits to the Web sites during the year.
 - Updated the Wisconsin FASD Resource Guide.

 - Prepared quarterly FASD e newsletter.
